
### **Association of Asian Pacific Community Health Organizations** September 2008

Who We Are: Established in 1987, the Association of Asian Pacific Community Health Organizations (AAPCHO) is a nonprofit national association representing community health organizations primarily serving Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Other Pacific Islanders (AAPI), particularly the low income and medically underserved, in the United States.

Who We Represent: AAPCHO represents 25 community-based organizations, predominantly community health centers, across the United States. AAPCHO members are located in comunities with high concentrations of medically underserved AAPIs, and are at the forefront in providing community responsive, financially affordable and culturally/linguistically appropriate primary care services.

Our Mission: To promote advocacy, collaboration and leadership that improves the health status and access for Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders within the United States, its territories and freely associated states, primarily through our member community health clinics.

## **AAPCHO Member Centers:**

Provide culturally and linguistically appropriate health care services to over 350,000 patients annually.

Provide comprehensive primary medical care including internal medicine, perinatal care, pediatric, nutrition, nursing, pharmaceutical, optometry, dentistry services, and enabling services.

Provide services in numerous languages and dialects including Cantonese, Hawaiian, Ilocano, Korean, Mandarin, Samoan, Tagalog, and Vietnamese.





#### 88% increase in AAPCHO Total Patients from 2000 to 2007




#### Total AAPCHO AAPI Patients from 2000 to 2007



Compared with the National Average Bureau of Primary Health Care Federally Qualified Health Center, the Average AAPCHO Center has:

- •Higher proportion of visits/year for health conditions: Asthma, Hypertension, Diabetes, Otitis Media, Mental Disorder
- •Higher proportion of LEP patients
- •Higher proportion of geriatric patients
- •Poorer patients (100% and below Federal Poverty Level)
